Course Type: Open, Online

About this course: This online course was based on the free modules developed by the International Spinal Cord Society at www.elearnsoci.org.

Who was invited to take part: Physiotherapy students and physiotherapists

Date that it ran: 28th April to 30th May, 2014

Time commitment: 15 hours over 5 weeks

Requirements: Participants were required to complete online lessons, engage with additional resources, take part in the conversation online and complete the course evaluation.

Assessment: There was a final quiz

Awards: Completion certificate plus 15 International Physical Therapy Continuing Education Units from the World Confederation for Physical Therapy (WCPT)

Cost to participants

The course was free to participants.

Characteristics of the participants

Ultimately, 3,500 participants formally registered for the course. They were from over 110 countries (see Appendix 1) and had a mix of experience (see Appendix 2). The most represented countries were:

A number of people joined the course but did not register. This was difficult to monitor.

Format

Participants were given 3 tasks each week, namely:

1. Complete 2 to 3 lessons that are part of www.elearnSCI.org – this is a website that provides freely accessible online training modules
2. Look at additional readings, videos and resources
3. Contribute to an online discussion run through a closed Facebook group

Aim of the course

The aim of this course was to equip physiotherapy students and inexperienced physiotherapists with sufficient knowledge to manage a person with SCI. This included assessing impairments, activity limitations and participation restrictions, setting appropriate goals of treatment, formulating an evidence-based treatment plan, implementing treatment and evaluating its success.

Facebook discussion

The online Facebook discussion was an important aspect of the course and participants were expected to post at least one comment each week.

The online discussion took place within a closed Facebook group. The FB group was called - Physio_SCI_MOOC.

Only participants of the course were invited to join and post messages to this group although it was difficult to be sure that all members of the Facebook Page were registered on the course (and some clearly were not).

Number of people who joined the Facebook page.....2,529
 Number of posts (estimation only)over 10,000

Communication with participants

Participants were sent an email at the beginning of each week. This outlined what they were expected to do that week and directed them to an appropriate URL to find the details. It also

provided an opportunity to communicate about any issues that had arisen in the previous week.

Funding for the course

The course was not funded and no-one received any financial benefit from being involved. The two course coordinators did however receive some local funding from their workplace to contribute to salary support for a small portion of the time they devoted to the course.

Physiopedia received no financial assistance to manage the course. They did however receive sponsorship from Elsevier which in turn received publicity through the Facebook postings. Elsevier may also have indirectly benefited through any sales generated of the course textbook (which was published by Elsevier).

Course textbook

The course textbook was:

Harvey L. Management of Spinal Cord Injuries: A guide for physiotherapists. Elsevier, 2008.

Access to this book was made free to participants for the duration of the course by Elsevier. In addition, delegates could freely download 3 chapters as PDFs. The chapters were accessed 20,000 times (see Appendix 3 for details).

Self-assessments for participants

Participants were given many opportunities at different stages to assess their knowledge and understanding of the topic through multiple choice quizzes. Participants received a score and feedback on right and wrong responses. These were provided in the following way:

Course videos with co-ordinators

Rachael Lowe interviewed the course co-ordinators throughout the course and posted these on the physiopedia website. They were primarily summaries of the past week and instructions on what to do in the upcoming week. Participants were invited to view them. Each was viewed between 150 and 400 times. Accreditation by World Confederation for Physical Therapy (WCPT)

The course was accredited by WCPT for 15 International Physical Therapy Continuing Education Units (IPT-CEUs). This required a detailed submission to WCPT. It was one of the first courses (face-to-face or online) to be accredited in this way.

Participants needed to do the following to gain the IPT-CEUs:

1. Contribute to the online Facebook discussion each week
2. Pass the post course quiz
3. Complete a course evaluation form

Certificates of completion

Participants were provided with a certificate of completion (see Appendix 4) provided they:

1. Were registered
2. Finished moving through all the physiotherapy-specific lessons on www.elearnSCI.org
3. Contributed to the online Facebook discussion each week
4. Completed the pre course quiz
5. Completed and passed the post course quiz
6. Completed a course evaluation form

Implications of course on usage of www.elearnSCI.org

The course was based on the physiotherapy-specific module of www.elearnSCI.org. This website was created by the International Spinal Cord Society and is freely available for all to access. The course increased usage of the website. This is evident through:

Number of registrants on the website:

Total number of registrants since website opened.....10,976

Number of physiotherapists we registered during the course.....2,975

Number of people who completed the self-assessments at the end of the physiotherapy lessons during the course (see Appendix 5 for details):

Prior to course 100 to 400
 During the course 1,000 to 1,500

Results of pre- and post-course assessment

Participants were invited to sit a pre and post course assessment. This consisted of 20 multiple choice questions. Prior to the commencement of the course pairs of questions were prepared and then one question of each pair was randomly assigned to the pre-course quiz and the other to the post-course quiz. This was done to ensure that there were no systematic differences in the difficulty of the pre and post-course quizzes. The results of these quizzes are provided in Appendix 6.

Attrition rate

It is difficult to accurately count the number of people who completed all aspects of the course, however, our best estimate is between 40% and 50%. This is based on the following statistics:

Number of people who opened the week 1 instructional email 80%¹
 Number of people who opened the week 5 instructional email 56%¹
 Number of people who opened the post-course email 54%¹
 Number of people who completed and passed the post course assessment 37%²

¹This does not include the 451/3,500 participants who did not provide a valid email address and therefore would not have received any emails although they would have been able to access the content of all emails on the physiopedia website.

²This does not include 16 people who attempted the post course assessment but failed.

The number of unique views to the physiopedia pages also provide some indication of attrition. The unique number of visits to the relevant pages are as follows:

Course evaluation

The number of participants who completed the evaluation 1,029

Participants were overwhelmingly positive about the course (see Appendix 7, 8 and 9 for details). They particularly liked:

- That it was free
- That it could be done in their own time and online
- It provided the opportunity to liaise with other students and physiotherapists from so many countries
- That the physiotherapy-specific modules on www.elearnSCI.org were easy to understand, used lots of images, were written in simple English, provided lots of opportunities to actively engage and included lots of videos.

Aspects that some participants did not enjoy included:

- It took longer than 3 hours per week
- It was not made clear from the beginning that they should not click on “read more” throughout the elearn lessons
- The Facebook Page had too many people posting to it and consequently it became overwhelming
- It was difficult to have meaningful discussions on the Facebook page
- It was compulsory to post to the Facebook page.

Future

The plan is to run this course each year. However this will be dependent on attracting some sponsorship to help offset the costs incurred by Physiopedia and the University of Sydney.







I have a few years experience working in spinal cord injuries so was able to read quickly through the elearn modules. Saying this I still took the allocated time of 3 contact hours a week. I think if this was new content for people then they would need more than 3 hours to absorb it.

Facebook discussions, though useful, suffered from a few issues that are inherent to facebook (i.e. older posts get pushed to the top by newer posts and are often 'forgotten'; not many options for thread organization and layout compared to, for instance, a forum or online thread -- as a result, topics are just stacked vertically, which makes searching through topics more confusing and slower.
The facebook discussions, although admittedly one of the best parts of the course, were also problematic

simply because of the large number of students enrolled (making it confusing and saturated with detail).
