- Professional rehabilitation associations in Uganda are tasked to offer CPD opportunities to their members.
- This is aimed at promoting and strengthening culturally relevant, evidence-based practice (EBP).





Background of the interprofessional Clinical Rehabilitation Skills Training

- The idea of a collaborative hybrid CPD clinical skills training program was to enable the different rehabilitation professionals share different perspectives, knowledge and skills.
- The PT, OT,SLT OTT associations participated in the training.





Description of the Hybrid CST

- Features structured online and in-person learning
- Offers an innovative and interprofessional approach that facilitates connections to expert knowledge and resources.
- Can be integrated into the local context and be conducted asynchronously with rehabilitation professionals around the country.





Description of the collaborative work done by Professional Associations in Uganda

Survey

Explored the perceived clinical training needs of rehabilitation professionals

Hybrid training

Incorporated interprofessional collaboration, stroke rehabilitation and assistive technology

Outcomes

Significant increase in knowledge, skills and greater appreciation for interprofessional practice.
